Day 01: 21ST JUNE, KOLKATA – MUMBAI

Day 02: 22ND JUNE, MUMBAI – ADDIS ABABA

On arrival at Mumbai, complete all the immigration formalities. Later, board the international flight from Mumbai to Windhoek in Namibia via Addis Ababa.

Arrive at Hosea Kutako International Airport and complete all immigration formalities before boarding the coach. Windhoek is a modern, historic city with modern architecture and cultural offerings. Windhoek is the gateway to breathtaking and exclusive luxury safari experiences in Namibia's stunning game reserves. The city itself is a unique blend of African and European cultures, with stunning German architecture and a range of gourmet restaurants, cafes and vibrant markets. Start your adventure in Windhoek, the capital and largest city of this South African country.

Head out to explore Namibia's capital city with a visit to the **Christuskirche** and the **statue of Hosea Kutako**, a nationalist hero, in the Parliament gardens surrounding the Tintenpalast, the seat of the Namibian legislature, or chow down on ostrich kebab or zebra steak at Joe's Beerhouse before leaving on a safari into the Namibian wilderness. Later, check-in to the hotel in Windhoek. Have dinner and stay overnight in Windhoek.

Day 2



Day 03: 23RD JUNE WINDHOEK – SPREETSHOOGTE PASS – SOSSUSVLEI

By Road

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, hit the road for the six-hour drive to **Sossusvlei** (365 km). Along the way, you'll pass by grand scenic passes and the infinitely vast **Namib Desert**, which stretches along the base of a mountain. Stop for lunch at **Spreetshoogte Pass** before continuing to Sossuvlei.

Sossuvlei is located in Africa's largest conservation area, the **Namib-Naukluft National Park**. The area is a large salt and clay pan surrounded by towering red dunes that create striking views in the morning and evening.

Our lodge here is just a few kilometres from the mighty dunes of Sossusvlei. Check-in to the hotel, have dinner and stay overnight in Sossuvlei.

Day 3



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Day 04: 24TH JUNE, SOSSUSVLEI – SESRIEM – SOSSUSVLEI

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast proceed to **Sesriem Canyon** to explore the dramatic landscapes. Sesriem Canyon is a small, 1 km long, and up to 30-meter deep gorge in the Namib Desert, Namibia, carved by the Tsauchab River over millions of years. Located near the Sossusvlei entrance, this natural landmark provides a scenic, cool, and shaded walking spot, featuring, at times, water-filled pools that sustain local, desert-adapted flora and fauna. We will view the ancient rock formations, and the winding trails will reveal millions of years of geological history.



Next, we will visit the legendary **Dune 45**, which is famous for its sweeping desert panoramas and the breathtaking glow of the sunrise over the sands. Dune 45 is named for its proximity to Sesriem Gate. It is situated 45km from the gate, along a paved road and is easily reached using a 2x4 vehicle. It's fascinating shape and accessibility makes it the most photographed dune in the world. Return to Sossusvlei in the evening for an overnight stay after dinner.



Day 05: 25TH JUNE, SOSSUSVLEI – SOLITAIRE – KUISEB CANYON – SWAKOPMUND

Day 5

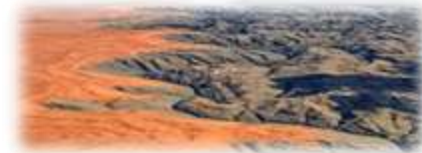

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Wake up in time to envisage the last sunrise at the **Sossusvlei dunes**. Have breakfast and check-out from the hotel. Then start the drive to **Swakopmund**, a five-hour drive (400 km) to the north. As you drive along the coast, the scenery gradually changes from mountains and dunes to rolling grass-covered hills dotted with stands of acacia trees.



Watch for the endemic Hartmann's mountain zebra and other Namibian wildlife on the way. Stop in the town of **Solitaire** (about halfway) for some homemade bread and an ice-cold drink.



Another 1.5-hour drive down the road is the scenic **Kuiseb Canyon**—stop here for a picnic in the shade and to take in the views. Springbok and ostrich roam the vast gravel plains of the Namib and welwitschia plants cover the arid ground.



After a beautiful drive, arrive in Swakopmund in the early afternoon. Have dinner and stay overnight in Swakopmund.

Day 06: 26TH JUNE, SWAKOPMUND – COASTAL EXPLORATION

Day 6

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After enjoying breakfast at hotel, we will have a full day to explore Swakopmund, a town celebrated for its unique colonial charm and diverse adventure activities. The day's highlights include exploring the scenic Atlantic coast and the local town area. Evening enjoy a beautiful sunset view from the beach.



Return to hotel in the evening for an overnight stay after dinner.

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Day 07: 27TH JUNE, SWAKOPMUND – SKELETON COAST – CAPE CROSS – TWFYLEFONTEIN – DAMARALAND

Day 7

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

In the morning, drive from Swakopmund to Damaraland, a five hours drive (430 km) to the north. The drive along the **Skeleton Coast** to Damaraland is full of incredible views, from grassy plains and dry riverbeds to coastal panoramas. The route takes you past **Cape Cross**, home to the world's largest breeding cape fur seal colony in the world. The sound of 100,000 seals can be deafening, but the sight of the animals is worth the stop.

Continue to Cape Cross Lodge or a picnic spot for lunch, then keep driving north. Other stops along the way include **lichen fields and the salt pans**—an excellent birding spot.

Arrive at **Damaraland** in the afternoon. Explore **Twyfelfontein**, a site of ancient rock engravings in the Kunene Region of north-western Namibia in the dry, rocky valley of the Damaraland highlands. It consists of a spring in a valley flanked by the slopes of a sandstone Table Mountain that receives very little rainfall and has a wide range of diurnal temperatures. The engravings, primarily on sandstone, depict animals, footprints and geometric patterns, often used to teach tracking or for ritualistic purposes. Here, wind and rain have spent eons carving enormous granite outcrops and dolerite dikes into incredible formations. Endless open skies and geologic formations add to the region's beauty.

After dinner, check-in to the hotel and stay overnight in Damaraland.



Day 08: 28TH JUNE, DAMARALAND – ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

Day 8 By Road

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, check-out from the hotel. Today we travel on to **Etosha**, Namibia's flagship national park where we enjoy our first **game drive** in the park. Etosha is one of Africa's great wildlife parks and Namibia's prime wilderness conservation area. Dominated by a giant salt pan, it is easy to the spot wildlife that gathers around the few watering holes to drink. Some of the species you may spot in the park include lion, leopard, cheetah, elephant, zebra and giraffe.

Etosha is massive, spanning over 22,700 square kilometers (that's nearly three-quarters the size of Belgium). And it's packed with almost 115 species of mammals, including four of the Big Five. There are also around 340 species of birds. All this makes for a very special safari experience.

Later, check-in to the resort at Etosha, have dinner and stay overnight.



Day 09: 29TH JUNE, ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

Day 9

Meals: Breakfast, Packed Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, **enjoy a full day game drive in open 4 X 4 vehicles.** Etosha National Park, located in northwestern Namibia, is one of the largest national parks in Africa. It is one of Africa's renowned wildlife areas and is located in Namibia's prime wilderness conservation area. A massive silver-white salt pan that can be seen from space is bordered by vast grassy plains, semi-arid savannah and thorn scrub that stretches across the park's 22 750 square kilometres (8 785 square miles) of land. The salt pan transforms into a stunning lake after heavy, seasonal rain and attracts a plethora of candy floss coloured flamingos that wade in the beryl algae. Etosha is home to myriad four-legged residents and close to 114 species of mammals, including the famed Big Five, elegant giraffe, rare black-faced impala, Hartmann's mountain zebra and the smallest antelope in the world, the Damara dikdik, which weighs no more than 6 kg. The park is celebrated as the home of the largest and perhaps the most stable population of the endangered black rhino in the world, as well as accommodating one of the high densities of giraffe in the area.

Game drives in Etosha National Park, Namibia, offer premier wildlife viewing, particularly around waterholes in the arid landscape. During the dry season (May to October), animals congregate at waterholes, making it the best time for game viewing. Morning and evening game drives through the park are a veritable feast for the senses, encompassing unbelievable scenery, fresh breezes that caress your face as the open-sided 4x4 ambles along, natural dusky perfumes that permeate the air and a veritable orchestra of African sounds.

Later, return to the hotel after dusk, have dinner and stay overnight at Etosha.



Day 10: 30TH JUNE, ETOSHA – CAPRIVI STRIP – OKAVANGO RIVER – DIVUNDU

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Enjoy breakfast and check-out from the hotel. It's a long drive today as we head out of Etosha National Park, journey north and enter the **Caprivi Strip**, a narrow stretch of Namibian territory between Botswana and Angola. Located in the northeastern sector of Namibia, the Caprivi Strip is a narrow strip of land tucked between Botswana, Angola, and Zambia. Often described as Namibia's answer to Botswana's **Okavango Delta**, the rivers, wetlands and forests of the Caprivi Strip supports a diverse range of animals that include several species such as hippo and buffalo that are absent from the country's more famous but far drier Etosha National Park. The strip was named after German Chancellor Leo von Caprivi.

In the late 1800s, he negotiated for ownership of the land in exchange for Zanzibar. Its original purpose was strategic: securing German access to the Zambezi River and serving as a military route in later conflicts.

Arrive at the lodge, check-in, have dinner and stay overnight at Divundu.



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Day 11: 01ST JUL, DIVUNDU – OKAVANGO DELTA AREA(BOTSWANA) - MAUN

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, we travel further into Maun, the gateway to the Okavango Delta, located in northern Botswana, is a vast, landlocked freshwater wetland in the **Kalahari Desert**, forming a unique inland alluvial fan where the Okavango River drains into desert sands. This is one of the world's largest inland deltas, known as an endorheic delta, where the river's 11 cubic kilometers of annual water volume is entirely absorbed by the Kalahari Desert. As a UNESCO World Heritage Site, it features seasonal floods that create a lush oasis of wildlife, including crocodiles, lions, and elephants, often explored via traditional mokoro canoes.

The region has deep roots with local communities, such as the BaYei, who are known for their traditional, skilled navigation of the waterways.

Arrive at the lodge. Relax and enjoy the unique experience of observing these majestic creatures up close, as they gather at the waterhole just steps away from our accommodation.

Stay overnight at Maun, Okavango Delta area.



Day 12: 02ND JUL, OKAVANGO DELTA AREA

Day 12

By Road

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast, explore the Okavango Delta by boat and on foot that offers a comprehensive, intimate and diverse perspective of one of Africa's most pristine, UNESCO-protected wetlands. This combination of activities allows you to navigate winding, lily-covered channels and explore dry, island-based habitats to see the full range of wildlife. Enjoy a mokoro (traditional canoe) cruise and guided game walks on land (depending upon water levels). Enjoy a **Mokoro Safari**. The traditional, silent, and environmentally friendly method, a mokoro (dugout canoe) allows you to glide through shallow, narrow reed-lined channels. Locals guide you through quiet, serene waterways, bringing you eye-level with painted reed frogs, kingfishers and aquatic plants. The Delta is home to the majority of Africa's iconic species, from giraffe to rhino and hippo to elephant.

In the evening, return to the hotel, have dinner and stay overnight at Okavango Delta area.



Day 13: 03RD JUL, MAUN (OKAVANGO DELTA AREA) – CHOBE NATIONAL PARK AREA

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Have breakfast and check-out of the hotel. Proceed to Chobe National Park to our lodge on the banks of the **Chobe River**. Not far away is a point where four countries (Namibia, Bolivia, Zambia and Zimbabwe) all converge.

Check into the lodge, have dinner and enjoy a comfortable overnight stay at Chobe National Park area.

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Day 14: 04TH JULY, CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Day 14

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Today, after breakfast, check out from our hotel and drive towards Chobe National Park in search of the Big Five. Keep your eyes peeled for elephants, hippos, crocodiles and other animals coming to the river edge to drink.

The first glimpse of the Chobe River is always breath-taking. It appears as a swathe of bright, blue ribbon, winding its way through the tiny town of Kasane and out into the Chobe National Park's wilderness. One of Africa's most beautiful rivers, the Chobe, supports a diversity and concentration of wildlife unmatched in Botswana. Established in 1968, Chobe National Park covers approximately 11,700 sq km, encompassing floodplains, swamps and woodland. The Chobe River rises in the northern Angolan highlands and travels vast distances before reaching Botswana at Ngoma. Like the Okavango and Zambezi rivers, the Chobe's course is affected by fault lines that are extensions of the Great Rift Valley. These three mighty rivers carry more water than all other Southern African rivers.

The largest concentration of elephant in Africa occupies this park and, in the mid- to late-afternoon, herd after herd comes down to the Chobe banks, some small in number and others counting in the hundreds. Each takes its turn to drink the precious water, swim in the cool river or just jostle for position. Antelope, giraffe, kudu, bushbuck, waterbuck, zebra, wildebeest, warthog, lion, leopard and the occasional African wild dog. Large herds of buffalo are found along the Chobe riverfront and grazing on the islands, crossing from one to the other or back to the mainland.

Evening check -in to the lodge, have dinner and stay overnight at Chobe National Park.



Day 15: 05TH JULY, CHOBE NATIONAL PARK – KASANE – VICTORIA FALLS TOWN VICTORIA FALLS TOUR (ZIMBABWE SIDE) & SUNSET CRUISE

After breakfast, check-out from the hotel and proceed from Botswana to Zimbabwe border. Complete all formalities and drive towards Victoria Falls Town.

On arrival proceed to view the falls. **Victoria Falls** is an increasingly popular tourist destination – it truly is remarkable. Victoria Falls is one of nature's intricate mysteries and features several principal gorges. 75% of the Falls can be seen from the Zimbabwean side, while the remaining 25% is visible from the Zambian side. On the Zimbabwe side of the Falls, you will find the Victoria Falls Rainforest, which is the only place on earth to see rain every single day of the year.

The rains bless the area with lush greenery in the forest. Victoria Falls is part of the mighty Zambezi River, which forms the border between Zimbabwe and Zambia.

In the evening, **enjoy Zambezi River Sunset Cruise or the Zambezi Sundowner Cruise** which is a superb way to relax and enjoy the spectacular beauty of the Zambezi River. Flocks of birds skim the waterline as the sun sets behind the African skyline. Guests may



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have the opportunity to see a variety of animals; including hippo, crocodile and elephant as well as enjoy the different bird species.

Later, enjoy a delicious dinner and return to the hotel for an overnight stay.

Proceed to the hotel for check-in. Later, have dinner and return to the hotel for an overnight stay.



Day 16: 06TH JULY, VICTORIA FALLS TOWN - DAY TRIP TO HWANGE NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, we will proceed toward Hwange National Park, a premier gateway to the African wilderness. This vast area, characterized by Kalahari sands, grasslands, and teak forests, hosts one of the highest concentrations of wildlife in Zimbabwe. It is particularly renowned for its large elephant populations that congregate around local waterholes.



During the day, we will enjoy a safari tour across diverse landscapes to witness these majestic creatures in their natural habitat.

We will set out on game drives in search of lions, leopards, sable antelopes, blue wildebeests, and giraffes. We will also keep a close watch for African wild dogs, which maintain a significant presence in this park despite their endangered status.



In the evening, we will return to Victoria Falls town for dinner and overnight stay.
